



The land on which The Wild Boar now stands, used to be Undermillbeck grazing common. In the early 1800's an allotment of the common had a small dwelling erected, which was later turned into a basket making workshop by Mr W. Hutchinson. Later on, he obtained a licence to sell beer and porter. He named his Inn "The Wild Boar" to commemorate the local legend of a particularly ferocious boar in the 12th century.

The Wild Boar became an Inn for Coaches on their way to Kendal back in 1895. Times have considerably changed since then but we still pay homage to our past with antique pieces, mixed with contemporary furnishings.
